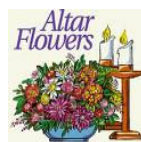

**Behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying,
"Where is the newborn king of the Jews?"**

Matthew 2:1-12

The identity and origin of the "magi from the east" is still debated by historians, theologians, anthropologist, and archaeologist. Most people would say that "There were *three* wise men." St. Matthew does not say that there were *three*. Men around the world studied the culture, the writings, the religions and the history of peoples other than their own. They believed in signs that told of great events. When the *magi* observed signs they believed told of a child descended from King David, born in Bethlehem, to be the *Anointed One* promised by God, they incurred the expense and endured the difficulty and perils of a long journey through hostile territory. They did not come to ask anything of the child. They brought gifts that signified His mission for all mankind and what He would suffer to fulfill that mission. Do we truly believe Jesus is the *Anointed One*? Do we act as if we believe? What are we willing to do, to give, to risk, to endure to act on that belief? Such are gifts we can offer to celebrate the Epiphany of Jesus.

Lets talk about Liturgy.....

Liturgy is the customary public worship done by a specific religious group, according to its particular traditions. The word, sometimes rendered by its English name....Mass, Liturgy of the Hours; Liturgy of the Eucharist.

1. A prescribed form or set of forms for public religious worship.
2. often Liturgy Christianity The sacrament of the Eucharist. ...

The origin of the liturgy

First in our of this discussion of origin we are confronted by three of the most difficult questions of Christian archeology,

1. From what date was there a fixed and regulated service such as we can describe as a formal Liturgy?
2. How far was this service uniform in various Churches?
3. How far are we able to reconstruct its forms and arrangement?

As to the first question it must be said that an Apostolic Liturgy in the sense of an arrangement of prayers and ceremonies, like our present ritual of the Mass, did not exist. For some time the Eucharistic Service was in many details fluid and variable. It was not all written down and read from fixed forms, but in part composed by the officiating bishop. As for ceremonies, at first they were not elaborated as now. All ceremonial evolves gradually out of certain obvious actions done at first with no idea of ritual, but simply because they had to be done for convenience. The bread and wine were brought to the altar when they were wanted, the lessons were read from a place where they could best be heard, hands were washed because they were soiled. Out of these obvious actions ceremony developed, just as our vestments developed out of the dress of the first Christians. It follows that when there was no fixed Liturgy at all, there could be no question of absolute uniformity among the different Churches.
