FLC Kitchen Training



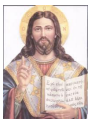

Gift Giving Opportunity



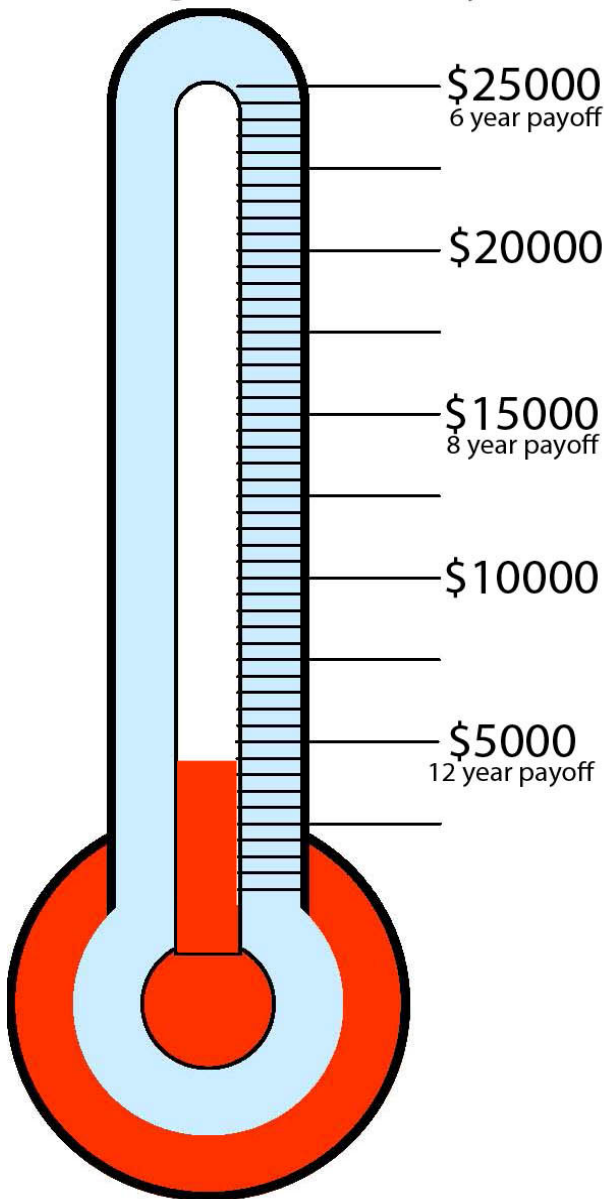
