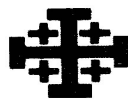

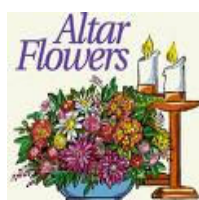

Pastor's Rundown:

Loving Father, you give us grace through sacramental signs, which tell us of the wonders of your "unseen power." This is a line from the prayers at the Easter Vigil service celebrating the resurrection. This is what we are celebrating today. The fact that throughout history, God has been triumphant over evil, even to the point of defeating sin and death! We see throughout Scripture, how God created light out of darkness, life out of dirt, freedom out of slavery, salvation out of doom at the Red Sea, and victory out of certain defeat at the walls of Jerusalem. All these events lead to what we are celebrating this weekend, the fact that death seemed to have won in the crucifixion of Jesus, but our God of life triumphed in bringing His son Christ to new and eternal life. We today can see the reality of the invisible love that God has for us in the visible nature of Christ walking and talking among his disciples. It is so great that we have a God who loves us so much that he is willing to take something that is so hard to comprehend (the power of love of God) and make it visible to us. This is exactly what we have been doing over this past week, taking ordinary earthly objects such as bread and wine, water and bowls, a hug and handshake, to convey Gods eternal presence, His loving service, and our call to share peace with one another. What great celebrations this has been and I give thanks to all of our parishioners here at Holy Family! The love of God and the mystery of the resurrection is made visible to me in the faces of all of you and the many people who helped pull this together. I wish all of you a very happy and blessed Easter season.
