In the Gospel today, Jesus stands in the midst of us and says: "Peace be with you!"

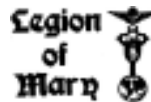

The Legion of Mary meets on Monday mornings at 9:00 AM on the garden level. All are invited to attend.

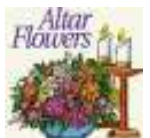

### *Pastor's Rundown:*

"Now we can begin the work." This was a direct quote from one of the staff people at Catholic Charities after we had spent a great deal of time moving into the new residential facility for seniors called Samaritan Place. It was literally months of grant applications, asking for money, carrying furniture, dusting, planning, rearranging not to mention the anxiety and stress. So when we had moved all that in and the ribbon had been cut to hear that we were just beginning was not at all encouraging! However, it was very true, we all had to buckle down and get going to start serving the people that we had worked to so hard to prepare for.

This same exact quote can be said of us here at Holy Family today. It seems crazy after all the work so many did to make Lent, Holy Week and Easter Sunday such a special time. So many people put all their hearts and hands and voices together to make this an amazing week of prayer and joy (despite a brief power outage and trouble with the statue being covered on Holy Thursday). So it seems really strange to hear that we are just beginning. You may be thinking, "Seriously? i gave up candy for forty days and now the work starts?" In a way it is true. Lent is a time of preparation and cleansing so that the Easter Season can be celebrated with a clean heart. So now the work of recognizing the fact that Jesus really is alive in our lives today! So we come together on this Sunday, which is called "Sunday in the Octave of Easter." I think that is interesting because the Church sets apart eight days of real celebration in honor of the resurrection. this is to symbolize the seven days it took for God to create the world and the eighth day which is the eternal day brought by the resurrection.

So our work this Easter season is to do all we can to let everyone know how Christ is alive through our love and respect for each other. Thanks so much to all of you for making this season such a glorious reflection of new life in Christ Jesus!
