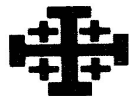

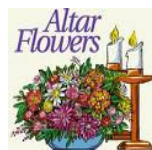

Pastor's Rundown:

I am so proud of Catholic Charities! We just returned from a Leadership Summit and our transitional housing program won an award for its effective and innovative approach to supporting formerly homeless families. The program allows families who had been living in a shelter, the street, a car, or another unsuitable location to enter an apartment where they receive intensive case management, counseling, job skills training and various other services. The families can remain in our housing for up to two years or until they become self sufficient. The award came with a \$25,000 grant from the Annie Casey Foundation. At their core, all of our programs have transformation as the goal. Whether it is helping families go from homelessness to stability, or children from abuse and neglect to safety and security our programs help people come to new life. This a great time to reflect on transformation during the season of Easter. We celebrate Jesus transformation from death to life and in so doing we are called to recognize our own transformation to a fuller life with Christ. We can see it all around us in the flowers blooming and leaves turning green. It is great to be part of a parish here at Holy Family that is aware of the transformative power the resurrection can have in our lives today. I hope you all know how special you are and how Christ is alive in you!
