After about ten years of being hosted by Holy Family, the Holy Resurrection Byzantine Mission, is relocating to another site where that community can flourish. With this move, there has been a bit of an empty feeling in the sanctuary. Therefore, I am working in consultation with the parish council and some of those involved in the liturgical ministries to help me find some fitting artwork to enhance our worship. John "Moe" Weis totally fixed up our processional cross which now looks great. We have some other good ideas and hopefully we can get that stuff set up soon.

Another exciting development in our parish is the renewal of our parish website! Tracy Staller and Kevin Quilliams have taken the lead in setting this up. Fr Andrew will be on hand to help us as his schedule allows. He will also be available to lend a hand at other local parishes that might need some assistance. You are going to love this guy! He is really great and we can look forward to him coming to live at Holy Family in the next few weeks too. Well, this is just a little update on some things that are happening around our parish.
